- 5. How do you bring out the excellence in teaching staff and how do you deal with mediocrity?
- 6. Could you talk to us about how you maintain your own personal professional development and what was the last thing you read that has shaped your professional practice?
- 7. How would you work to enhance the climate at the high school or building a team with new leadership? I think that the high school has a reputation for some negativity among staff.
- 8. Differentiated instruction is an area that needs focus at the High School level, what are your experiences with DI and how would you help support teachers in this area?
